

PHONICS WORD SORT GAME BOARDS, GRADE 2+ INTRODUCTION

Students enjoy the game-like features of *Phonics Word Sort Game Boards*, *Grade 2*+, while learning to read and spell important high frequency grade 2 words. The words are from the *National Reading Vocabulary* and other words important for grade 2. The key to the program's success is word organization and rhyming. The word organization makes them much easier to learn.

PRESENTING THE PROGRAM

Students begin the program with the first game board and work through the game boards in sequence, or they read the words on the word sort game boards to determine where to begin. They read the words down and across and begin where they have reading difficulty.

Most of the game boards have the same structure. Presenting the program requires only that teachers become familiar with the structures of game boards 1, 2, 3, and 4, on pages 1, 2, 3, and 4.

FOR THE TEACHER:

Word Sort Game Board 1, Page 1 (Words Rhyme Across)

(In game board 1, students practice matching and reading rhyming words and non-rhyming words.)

- Pronounce and discuss the words with students.
- Students trace the words. They say each word as they are tracing. They trace the words from left to right, the rhyming words.
- After students have traced the words, they cut the words on the right, the words with the dotted lines.
- Students practice sorting the words (matching the words by identical endings).
- Students practice reading the words across, the rhyming words.

- After practice, students read the words down, the non-rhyming words.
- The word cards also can be used for speed sorts, to see how quickly students can complete the word sorts, and for games such as *Concentration* and other card games.

Word Sort Game Board 2, Page 2 (Word Completion)

(In game board 2, students place the correct endings next to the words as you say them.)

- The word endings in the bottom of the page are in the correct order for the completed words. Keep the page as your master. For example, the words for page 2, Word Sort Game Board 2, are had, get, mix, fix, dot, hug, win, top.
- Help students cut out the letter cards on the bottom of the page. They put the correct word endings next to the beginning consonants as you say the words.
- For added practice, students match the word endings on their own. For extra credit, they match any letters that make a word. Even if the letters do not make real words, they benefit from pronouncing them.

Word Sort Game Board 3, Page 3 (Words Rhyme Down)

(In game board 3, students practice matching and reading rhyming words and non-rhyming words.)

- Pronounce and discuss the words with students.
- Students trace the words. They say each word as they are tracing. They trace the words down, the rhyming words.
- After they have traced the words, help students cut out the word cards.
- Students practice sorting the words (matching the words by

identical endings).

- Students practice reading the words down, the rhyming words.
- After practice, students read the words across, the non-rhyming words.
- The word cards also can be used for speed sorts, to see how quickly students can complete the word sorts, and for games such as *Concentration* and other card games.

Word Sort Game Board 4, Page 4 (Word Completion)

(In game board 4, students place the correct beginning consonants next to the words as you say them.)

- The word endings in the bottom of the page are in the correct order for the completed words. Keep the page as your master. For example, the words for page 4, Word Sort Game Board 4, are ball, fell, sell, tell, well, bill, fill, hill, will, still.
- Help students cut out the letter cards on the bottom of the page. They put the correct word endings next to the beginning consonants as you say the words.
- For extra credit, students find other letters that will make words. Even if the letters do not make real words, they benefit from pronouncing them.

SPELLING NOTEBOOKS

After practice, students write teacher selected words to develop spelling notebooks.




